
Dear Mr. Karney,

This responds to your February 11th letter requesting comments on potential revisions to the **Energy Star** criteria for windows, doors, and skylights.

As a medium size manufacturer of window products, Sun Windows, Inc. strongly supports the three-zone alternative as new criteria for the **Energy Star** windows program. From a manufacturing and marketing standpoint, we favor the relative simplicity of three zones instead of four. Educated and informed consumers increasingly demand windows that both insulate well and reduce summer cooling requirements. As the Department of Energy analysis points out, these properties are best captured in the three-zone alternative.

I urge you to adopt the three-zone alternative as the new standard for the **Energy Star** windows program.
