Subject: Draft AB Requirements

We were informed that a case of abuse of Energy Star had occurred which might have been partly due to radically broadened coverage of products in this program in the U.S.A.

These might include cases of trivial mistakes such as erroneous description. However, a stringent measure or penalty should be imposed upon such cases as repeated offense occurs or admittedly intentional fraud in a self-certifying process, though being a voluntary standard.

Our company; however, has long had a high regard to this self-determined process and had no problem in coping with this process so far, as described above.

In addition, we consider that an excellent outcome would result if the measurement facility of each company in our industry obtain ISO 9001 certification as an international quality standard.

Therefore, our company strongly desires that the self-certifying process will continue to exist in the future, as before.
