Currently our lab maintain accreditation to ISO/IEC 17025 of TAF (Taiwan Accreditation Foundation, the national ILAC full member), however If TAF Is not an accredited AB by EPA, then does that mean we have to get accreditation from another EPA accredited AB? If It Is so, I think It would rather be a burden to our lab and I think would be the same to others' too. Would It be possible to change It to maintain accreditation to ISO/IEC 17025 to the national ILAC member Instead of EPA accredited AB? As I believe that most of the qualified labs are recognized and maintain accreditation to ISO/IEC17025 of the local ILAC member, this would be a cheaper and less burden approach to most of the qualified labs.
