Dear ENERGY STAR Imaging Equipment Stakeholder:

To follow up on the e-mail you received on March 24, EPA would like to provide you with the following materials from our March 16 discussion on ENERGY STAR qualified imaging equipment:

- Final attendee list;
- Meeting notes; and
- Proposed revised definitions and terminology.

Please remember that EPA has asked that you **discontinue TEC testing at this time**. EPA will thoughtfully consider comments received and will distribute a revised TEC test procedure in mid-April. Partners will then be asked to conduct tests on a *representative sample* of products over the next month. EPA may be in touch with certain manufacturers during this time to request the testing of specific products. EPA will then evaluate the interim data received to answer any remaining questions about the TEC test procedure. A final TEC test procedure will be distributed at the end of May, which will be used by industry to test the full range of products. Following is a summary of key activities and dates for your reference.

Key Activities and Dates:

Industry meeting	March 16
EPA distributes request to halt TEC testing	March 24
EPA distributes meeting notes and revised time line	March 30
EPA distributes revised OM and TEC test procedures, based on meeting comments, and requests interim testing to TEC	April 15
Deadline for industry submission of interim TEC data	May 16
EPA evaluates remaining TEC test procedure questions based on interim data	May 16 – May 31
EPA distributes final TEC and OM test procedures and asks industry to begin full testing to TEC	May 31
EPA releases first draft specification, with no power or energy levels	June
Industry meeting, exact date TBD	July – September
Deadline for comments on first draft specification.	August
Deadline for final TEC and OM data	September
EPA distributes second draft specification with power and energy levels	December
Industry meeting	Jan – Feb., 2006
Deadline for comments on second draft specification	February, 2006
Final specification	March, 2006
Specification effective date	March, 2007

It is hoped that the amendments to the above timeframe will allow sufficient time to develop the best possible specification and test procedures. Thank you again for your contributions to this process.
