Dear ENERGY STAR Imaging Equipment Stakeholder:

For your review, please find attached the ENERGY STAR Imaging Equipment Draft 2 (Version 1.0) Specification **Stakeholder Comment Response Summary**. This summary attempts to capture all stakeholder comments and requests related to the Draft 2 specification and share EPA's decisions related to these matters. In cases where EPA is continuing to assess data or consider stakeholder requests, it is noted that decisions on these matters will be relayed in the Draft 3 specification, which is scheduled for release on March 17, 2006.

EPA thanks stakeholders who have already provided input in response to the action-item list that was distributed earlier this week. For stakeholders who have not yet shared feedback, as a reminder, the areas below are those where EPA would appreciate receiving input as soon as possible:

- Defining electronic labeling examples;
- Supplying additional product data for Large-format products addressed by the Operational Mode (OM) approach;
- Proposing alternative Typical Electricity Consumption (TEC) criteria lines, including rationale and data;
- Reviewing for accuracy the TEC dataset posted on the ENERGY STAR Web site at www.energystar.gov/productdevelopment; and
- Confirming that imaging products with internal Digital Front-ends (DFEs) can be metered separately.
