Dear ENERGY STAR Stakeholder,

This is a reminder that the EPA has established a transition schedule to advance the minimum program requirements in states where ENERGY STAR Multifamily New Construction (MFNC) Version 1.0 are still in effect.

Multifamily buildings permitted on or after January 1, 2024, in the following states, as well as Guam and the Northern Mariana Islands, will be required to use Version 1.1 of the National ENERGY STAR Multifamily New Construction (MFNC) program requirements:


As a reminder, the only differences between the v1.1 program requirements from the prior version are a higher-performing Energy Rating Index (ERI) target and a more stringent prescriptive compliance path. All of the inspection checklists remain the same. Because this program version is already in use in other states, partners can generate compliance reports for this version in software rating tools today.
