This is a reminder that EPA has established a transition schedule to advance the minimum program requirements in states where ENERGY STAR Single-Family New Homes Version 3.0 and Multifamily New Construction Version 1.0 are still in effect.

Single-Family New Homes

Single-family homes permitted on or after <u>January 1, 2023</u>, in the following states will be required to use Version 3.1 of the National ENERGY STAR Single-Family New Homes program requirements:

Multifamily New Construction

Multifamily buildings permitted on or after <u>January 1, 2024</u>, in the states above*, as well as Guam, Hawaii, and the Northern Mariana Islands, will be required to use Version 1.1 of the National ENERGY STAR Multifamily New Construction (MFNC) program requirements.

As a reminder, the only differences in the v3.1 and v1.1 program requirements from the prior versions are a higher-performing Energy Rating Index (ERI) target and, for the MFNC program, a more stringent prescriptive compliance path. All of the inspection checklists remain the same. Because these program versions are already in use in other states, partners can generate compliance reports for these versions in software rating tools today.
