

## ENERGY STAR® RESIDENTIAL NEW CONSTRUCTION PROGRAMS







## Dear California Stakeholders,

In response to California's more stringent 2022 Building Energy Efficiency Standards, EPA is proposing new versions of the ENERGY STAR Residential New Construction Program Requirements for California: Single-Family New Homes (SFNH) Version 3.4 and Multifamily New Construction (MFNC) Version 1.4. To view the draft program requirements visit the <a href="ENERGY STAR">ENERGY STAR</a> website.

The primary change in these proposed new versions is to increase overall program stringency by updating the performance target:

- For the SFNH program the following two options are proposed:
  - 1. A Compliance Margin (EDR2) ≥10% above 2022 Building Energy Efficiency Standards, or,
  - 2. An Efficiency EDR ≥ 5 points above 2022 Building Energy Efficiency Standards
- For the MFNC program, a Compliance Margin (TDV) ≥10% above 2022 Building Energy Efficiency Standards is proposed.

Mandatory features (i.e., the national program checklists) are proposed to remain unchanged relative to the current program requirements in California.

In addition, EPA is proposing to revise its policy for determining which version of the program must be used to certify homes and apartments, to be based on a home's or building's permit date and the edition of code being enforced by the Authority Having Jurisdiction.
