ENERGY STAR certified homes and apartments that use an Energy Ratings Index-based (ERI) compliance path must be certified through an EPA-recognized Home Certification Organization (HCO) in accordance with the Standards and ENERGY STAR Residential New Construction national and regional Program Requirements identified below. Refer to the Implementation Timeline exhibit within each program requirements document to determine the Version and, if applicable, the Revision that is required to be used for each home or apartment.
