Congratulations on your new home!

To earn the Indoor airPLUS label, a home must be independently inspected and tested to meet rigorous requirements set by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. One of those requirements is to first earn the US EPA's ENERGY STAR label. At this time, your home has been independently verified to meet a majority of the requirements of the Indoor airPLUS and ENERGY STAR Residential New Construction programs. However, due to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) situation, the onsite diagnostic tests required by the programs have not yet been performed. These important tests, which can be completed by your builder's home energy rater at a later date, are required for your home to earn the ENERGY STAR and the Indoor airPLUS labels.
