

## ENERGY STAR® RESIDENTIAL NEW CONSTRUCTION PROGRAMS



## Dear ENERGY STAR Residential New Construction EEPS Partners,

All sponsor organizations partnered with the EPA's ENERGY STAR Residential New Construction program (ENERGY STAR program) are required to complete a 5-10 minute **annual EEPS update** that provides updated information on their residential new construction program activities and the way in which they incorporate ENERGY STAR. Completion of this update fulfills the EPA Partnership Agreement requirement for program plan submittal and regular program updates.

To retain your organization's active partnership status with the ENERGY STAR Residential New Construction program, this update must be completed <u>annually</u>. If you work on behalf of more than one organization that is partnered with the ENERGY STAR program, you are expected to complete a separate update for each organization.

To streamline your response, we suggest organizing the following information before beginning the update:

- Brief (1,000 character limit) overview of your incentive program to be featured on the ENERGY STAR Nationwide Incentive List.
- Total number of single-family and manufactured homes, and low-, mid-, and high-rise units for which incentives were
  provided by your program in 2022 and projected totals for 2023.
- An understanding of your residential new construction program design details to answer a series of multiple-choice questions.
