1. Why Updating Your Information is Important

Each year, driven by EPA's ongoing national promotions and consumer education efforts, hundreds of thousands of visitors to the [ENERGY STAR Rebate Finder](#) database find valuable information about the ENERGY STAR product incentives that our energy efficiency program sponsor partners offer. Additional visitors access the [ENERGY STAR Product Finder](#).

The ENERGY STAR Database for Incentives and Joint Marketing Exchange ([DIME](#)) and the annual ENERGY STAR Product Program Summaries for [Appliances](#), [Lighting](#), [HVAC & Smart Thermostat Programs](#), and [Water Heaters](#) also showcase your offerings. The ENERGY STAR Program Summaries are distributed to over 5,000 manufacturer and retailer partners before each fall's ENERGY STAR Products Partner Meeting to help partners identify opportunities to collaborate on ENERGY STAR products programs and promotions and solidify their plans through in-person meetings while on-site.

These resources are also referenced by other organizations in the energy efficiency community to inform their own tools, resources, analyses, and reports.

2. Instructions for Submitting New or Updated Program Information (for 2020 and Beyond)

For your convenience, please submit *all known promotional information* for 2020, 2021, and beyond. You are encouraged to submit program information even if your organization has stopped accepting applications to collaborate with other stakeholders. **To access the spreadsheet and detailed instructions click [here](#).**

Please ensure that all yellow cells have been updated. There are a few changes to product names that need to be addressed by all partners offering incentives on those products. Partners who provide incentive data on products that do not align with ENERGY STAR will receive requests for clarification and incentives will not be posted on Rebate Finder until product names align.

NOTE: Incentives only appear on the ENERGY STAR Rebate Finder when the associated start date is valid and column B in the spreadsheet has been marked "yes".

3. 2020 Coordination with the Consortium for Energy Efficiency

EPA and the Consortium for Energy Efficiency (CEE) each gather data annually from energy efficiency program

sponsors for different objectives and audiences. In 2020 we are coordinating to avoid duplicative requests for program details. Data received by EPA in the coming months will be shared with CEE and used to populate their program summaries. CEE will collect additional program details not encompassed in this data request.
