Combination Product Definition	<p>A stakeholder requested that EPA update the definition for combination products to remove the description of principal function (as a function other than actively removing particulate matter from the air) because the examples provided of what a principal function may be (humidifier or dehumidifier) are just examples and not an exclusive list. They believed this may create confusion if interpreted as any air cleaner device incorporating other air treatment technologies such as activated carbon, VOC reduction, etc. as principal functions. This may lead to the belief that products with these functions would be excluded from the scope of the specification.</p>	<p>Due to these concerns, EPA has edited the definition of combination product to remove the term principal function and its definition as a function other than actively removing <i>particulate matter</i> from the air. Instead, EPA refers to a combination product as one that has any additional function that is <u>not</u> related to <i>air purification</i> since technologies such as activated carbon and VOC reduction are air purification technologies. EPA believes this will prevent any confusion regarding the intended exclusion of products that combine air cleaning technologies with another function such as dehumidification.</p>
Ozone Emissions	<p>A stakeholder suggested that EPA reference the UL 867 standard in Section 3.2.1 which notes that measured ozone emissions should not exceed 50 parts per billion.</p>	<p>EPA updated Section 3.2.1 to reference the UL 867 Ed. 5.0 as the test standard required for measuring ozone emissions.</p>
Network Connection Testing	<p>A stakeholder requested clarification regarding testing to determine Measured Partial On Mode Power. They suggested that EPA state if products that have network connection capabilities would need to be tested with network connection enabled to ensure that the measured power is under the 2 W requirement, and again with it disabled to ensure that it meets the 1 W requirement.</p>	<p>EPA clarified that models with Wi-Fi capability would not need to be with and without this capability enabled during testing. These models only need to be tested once, with Wi-Fi capability enabled. All models with network connection capability only need to be tested once, per the instructions in Section 5.2.1.</p>
