Families and businesses are saving with the help of ENERGY STAR®

Mississippi is home to about **60** businesses and organizations participating in U.S. EPA's ENERGY STAR program:

8 manufacturers of ENERGY STAR certified products

3 companies supporting independent certification of ENERGY STAR products and homes

10 companies building ENERGY STAR certified homes,

as well as many businesses, schools, governments, and faith-based groups using ENERGY STAR to reduce energy waste.

Across Mississippi

898 thousand customers were served by ENERGY STAR utility partners in 2018

843 buildings (almost 72 million square feet) were benchmarked in 2018 using EPA's ENERGY STAR Portfolio Manager

4,179 homes have earned the ENERGY STAR

77 buildings have earned the ENERGY STAR for superior efficiency, including 31 schools, 3 hospitals, 2 office buildings and 2 industrial plants.

State Spotlights

Nissan became an ENERGY STAR Partner in 2006. Within the same year, the Canton plant focused on energy efficiency by establishing cross-functional energy management teams. These teams started looking into ways **Nissan** could help reduce energy consumption with a concentration on energy waste reduction and elimination. In January 2010, the plant received an energy reduction grant through the state of Mississippi, which allowed it to implement energy saving projects that will reduce energy consumption by **over 70,000 MMBTU per year**. That is equivalent to the energy used in **511 homes**.

As part of the ENERGY STAR Change the World tour 2016, **Energy Mississippi, Inc.** donated **37,000** ENERGY STAR certified bulbs to a local food network, which will be distributed to families in need to help them save energy.

The oldest ENERGY STAR Certified building in Mississippi is **Moss Point High School**, in Moss Point, MS, built in 1938. The building was first certified in 2013 with a score of 86.
