ENERGY STAR and Title 24



- ENERGY STAR V4.0 specification meets or exceeds Title 24 requirements for high efficacy fixtures.
- V4.0 released January 2005; effective October 1, 2005. (i.e. all labeled fixtures after Oct 1 must meet V4.0)
- ENERGY STAR fixtures meet color, durability, life, and other quality and performance parameters that are not required under Title 24.



ENERGY STAR Fixture Availability for Title 24 Requirements



- Thousands of recessed downlights, decorative pendants, decorative linear, undercabinet and other fixtures for use in the kitchen.
- Thousands of close-to-ceiling, wall sconce, decorative vanity, and utilitarian fixtures for bathroom, hallway and living applications.
- Over 100 ENERGY STAR qualified recessed downlights in all trims and wattages, including popular 26 watt 1-lamp fixtures and 2X13W 2-lamp fixture.



ENERGY STAR Outreach Efforts



- Manufacturers – new products, outreach and training.
- Showrooms and distributors – training, ENERGY STAR product selection, ENERGY STAR marketing.
- CBIA, CEC, utilities – promote ENERGY STAR solution.
- Builders – Direct outreach, design, product selection, marketing.

- Use ENERGY STAR as the quality solution
 - ENERGY STAR qualified fixtures must meet quality and performance requirements in addition to efficacy
- ENERGY STAR fixtures are readily available and identifiable
 - Helps builders identify quality fixtures that meet Title 24
- Title 24 will help spur the market for ENERGY STAR fixtures in California and nationally
