1) One series of residential used self-ballasted CFL(Compact Fluorescent Lamps) with GU-24 base including 13, 18 and 26 watts are being developed by us, however, we heard that ENERGY STAR will require the CFL shall be separated from the ballast, both cannot be integrated that will be effective from 2010. Is that true?

2) Regarding to 190-watt limited requirement on the TORCHIERES, the marketing seems shrinkage, also heard that only the torchieres with metal shade must be limited, plastic shade doesn't. One of our important items is the 190-watt limited switch, your precise answer will be a well guide in our business strategy.
