Hello Energy Star team. My comments are as follows:

1. Page 4 under Lamp; create = created
2. Page 7; recognized accreditation bodies should be listed or there will be issues. So if A2LA and NIST NVLAP and the two that will be recognized then it should say so.
3. Page 24 in the Note section there is a direct reference to UL whereas it should say: "availability of photosensors listed or certified by a NRTL for outdoor applications"
4. Page 30 under required documentation there is a direct reference to UL whereas it should say "any laboratory registered with a NRTL to perform this test."
5. Page 33, first line, there is a direct reference to UL whereas it should say "qualified luminaires carrying a NRTL damp or wet label...."
6. Page 35, under ENERGY STAR Labeling of Luminaire; there is the term "certification mark" in reference to Energy Star. I believe the use of the word certification could be incorrect. Maybe we just drop the word or replace it with the word qualified instead. The term "certification" in the realm of regulatory compliance holds a lot of weight and implies ongoing auditing / investigation to assure compliance.
