Quick Facts about the 2013 Competitors

Below is a by-the-numbers look at the competitors in the 2013 ENERGY STAR National Building Competition.

- In the spirit of a “biggest-loser” weight-loss competition, more than 3,200 competitors are battling it out to see who can reduce energy use the most.
- Competitors represent all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.
- Competitors represent more than 25 different types of commercial buildings, such as schools, hotels, retail stores, and sports stadiums.
- The oldest building in the competition is the Robert C. McEwen U.S. Custom House in Ogdensburg, NY, built in 1810 and owned by the U.S. General Services Administration
- More than 100 competing buildings are over 100 years old!
- The average size of buildings in the competition is approximately 159,000 square feet. Combined, competitors total more than 500 million square feet of floor space.

The Competition Footprint in Equivalencies

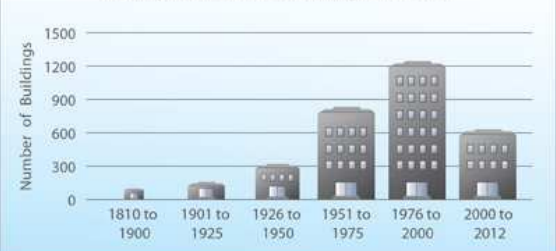
The total square footage of competitors is more than 520 million square feet, which is equivalent to:
